



CAT FECES REMOVAL GUIDE

1. REMOVE CAT FECES

After identifying the location of the cat feces in the garden bed, remove the feces using gloves and put it into a garbage bag. Make sure to remove a substantial amount of soil surrounding the feces to ensure that there is none remaining in the bed.

2. CLEAR THE FRAME OF PRODUCE AND WEEDS

To ensure that the cat feces has not infected any of the produce in your garden or farm, remove all plants within the same frame in which the feces was found. Toss these plants into the garbage bag. After the frame is cleared, dispose of your gloves as well, and throw out the garbage bag.

3. PUT LANDSCAPE FABRIC OVER FRAME

Cover the empty frame in which the cat feces was found with a layer of landscape fabric and pin it down with metal stakes in order to heat the soil and kill any bacteria left over from the disposed cat feces.

4. MARK AREA

In a clear way, mark the frame you have been working on and indicate that cat feces was found, and write down the date on which the feces was removed.

5. LEAVE FOR 100 DAYS

Do not plant in the affected frame for at least one hundred days to ensure that bacteria that may remain in the soil does not affect any produce that would be planted in the frame. After one hundred days, it is safe to plant in the frame again, as any remaining bacteria in the soil will have been killed from the heat.
