## Call the Community In - It's Easy to Do!

Organize Work Days to gather help and interest
o Set up Dates (and rain dates) at the beginning of the season and tell your nearby churches, schools, neighbors about those dates!

- 1 day for cleaning out the garden in the spring
- 2 days for weeding/planting/watering during the season
- 1 day for cleaning out the garden when plants die in the fall
o Contact churches, schools and homes near your garden - they might want to help but need someone to tell them when
- Posters on light posts or in mailboxes (be sure to take them down)
- Announcements give to church and school offices
- Phone calls
- A big sign in your garden 3 weeks ahead of time
- How else?
- Label garden beds with community gardener or teacher's names. Signs help others feel ownership.
o This can be done on a Work Day!
- Painted Rocks
- Painted Roof Shingles
- Painting the side of the bed itself!
- Celebrate together with a cookout or picnic in your garden with fresh vegetables from your plots
o Bring a grill and olive oil and challenge gardeners to be creative!
o Have kids carefully cut up tomatoes, cilantro, onions and whatever else they like for a healthy, messy outdoor salsa.
o Blindfolded herb taste tests are fun and silly!
- Make Your Garden Your Own by asking community members or students to fill it with art or sculptures
o Stack painted rocks
o Paint veggies on old plywood to reuse it!
o Wrap ribbons around trees or weave it into the garden fence
